I Security

Network Access Control (mobile devices such as laptops, IPads, phones; wireless devices, etc.)

- Control/restrict unauthorized devices brought into district network
- Policy enforcement joining domain
- Mobile Filter (1:1 computing)
- Wireless Issues (better control)
- Group Policies
- AUP's are they up-to-date? Should include phones, social networking, etc.

II. Technologies Today and Tomorrow

Session 1 – Voice-over-IP (VoIP)

- Migrating to VoIP Planning ideas.
