INFOHIO ACQUIRES GENYES STUDENT TECHNOLOGY LEADERSHIP PLATFORMS AND INSTRUCTIONAL CONTENT FOR OHIO SCHOOLS Click for Youtube Video about GenYes Ohio at Mentor High

Through the RemotEDx initiative, INFOhio will provide free access to the GenYES student technology leadership platforms and instructional content beginning with the 2022-2023 school year. The platform and resources have been acquired through the RemotEDx initiative and will be accessible through the RemotEDx Exchange website and the INFOhio website.

Ohio's current GenYES users should contact their ITC for support through this school year. Although the national GenYES program has closed, the Management Council and INFOhio's acquisition of the platform and content will ensure that the program can continue for Ohio's current GenYES users without interruption and for additional Ohio schools in the future.

The GenYES program provides an introduction to computer science, coding, and STEM careers, as well as careers in teaching and education. Students learn through action while supporting others and completing projects that demonstrate their learning. The program is flexible and is designed to support school technology integration goals, while building the next generation of technology leaders.

Student participants in the program become Student Technology Leaders (STLs) at their school. STLs:

- Learn about technology through projects created to support their school's tech integration goals
- Develop communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and leadership skills
- Support teachers and peers by providing mentoring, tech support, and practical leadership to support learning

GenYES can be implemented as a regular class or extracurricular club. More information about the GenYES program and resources will be coming soon.


The GenYES platform and content will be added to INFOhio's portfolio of student and educator tools that are freely available to all Ohio schools. It will also be made available as part of a larger toolkit to accelerate and personalize learning through student leadership and student empowerment. Through this toolkit Ohio schools will be able to leverage the GenYES platform and content to support a host of initiatives related to student leadership and empowerment.

STUDENT EMAIL PASSPHRASES ARE HERE!

We are now able to randomly generate easy to remember passphrases for student email accounts instead of the current random jumble of letters and numbers. If you would like to make a change to the password format for your district, please submit a helpdesk request to support@access-k12.org and let us know the desired format ie capitalized 3 letter word, random 2 digit number, lower case four letter word, special character (Red27test!).



Join a GOOGLE MEET call from Google Docs, Sheets, or Slides

What's changing:

You can now join a Google Meet call from Google Docs, Sheets, and Slides. In addition to the present to Meet option, you can select "Join the call" to quickly join and present a document, spreadsheet, or presentation to all attendees, allowing everyone in the meeting to collaborate while having a conversation.

Security Enhancement: Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)

Over the summer Duo MFA was rolled out to the fiscal software. Now all fiscal logins are secured with multi-factor authentication..

The student information system is planning to implement MFA summer 2023. There's a lot that can change between now and then, so stay tuned.

GoGuardian Rollout!

ACCESS rolled out GoGuardian web filtering to districts over the summer. With GoGuardian there are other services available on top of basic web filtering. Contact Mike Palmer (palmer@access-k12.org) to learn more.

UPDATE: ACCESS DR Site Storage Upgrade Is Complete

ACCESS will begin contacting districts to discuss options for accessing their portion of the solution. Contact network@access-k12.org to discuss options and scheduling.

District storage allocation can be used to hold backups of critical infrastructure, as a file share for district personnel, storage for virtual machines or disaster recovery usage.

WAN Upgrades

ACCESS completed updating firmware on all our WAN nodes. This helps us maintain a secure and efficient network environment. Put in a Help Desk ticket if you would like assistance updating your equipment.

Google MFA

Did you know that ACCESS can enforce MFA for your Google users? The enforcement can be assigned by OU, so you can can be granular about the assignment. ACCESS recommends that you enforce MFA for at least your administrators and your fiscal staff. Please put in a help desk ticket of you have questions or would like to get started.

REMINDER: Technology Coordinators - AD & Google Account Clean Up

We have years of OU's and accounts in our Active Directory that require maintenance. Please review your school's account information within the ACCESS AD and **remove all those no longer valid**, i.e. graduated students, and teachers/staff/administrators no longer within your district. We encourage you to keep the last grad year until the next grad year students graduate.

When you are done with your clean-up, open a ticket letting us know. We will then remove any old associated Google Accounts. Reducing the usage to only active accounts contributes to maintaining good security in our environment and minimizing licensing needs.

REDESIGN UPDATE....

The Work Flows module is now available in the redesign.

Requisitions may now be processed within the software using the work flows set up within it. If you are interested in automating the process of requisition approvals, please let us know and we will assist with the implementation.

Employee Onboarding is also available which allows users from different departments to enter employee information within USPS-r into a holding area for verification and processing into the live files. This work flow moves from person to person after each enters the information required and then submits to the next for further input or verification.



NEW! Learning Center in ProgressBook Suite

This change will be part of the 22.0 release update, and provides keyword searching and topic based articles, in addition to the traditional User Guides and Procedural Checklists.



Entering Course History records for New Students

Did you know course history data for newly enrolled students can be transferred in from other ACCESS districts, instead of manually entering to StudentInformation? This *must* be done as part of the registration process, so it's important to come up with a plan in your district to ensure the proper steps are taken in the proper order.

If you are using a third party registration software, you can still transfer in the course history records and then sync your student data.

Server Error

Some users use both the Live and Play environments. Please know if you are trying to log into both simultaneously, you will need to either use two different browsers or an incognito/guest window for one of those sessions moving forward. If you use multiple tabs within the same browser and try to log into both sites, you will receive a Server Error.

NEW! FY23 - Exiting Student Follow-up Record

Beginning with the FY23 school year, districts will collect and report to EMIS follow-up data on students who left secondary education before the current school year. Students reported will fall in one or more of the following categories:

- Students who exited and were career-technical concentrators
- Students who graduated during the prior school year, including summer graduates
- Students who at the time of exiting were reported with a disability condition

ODE will provide districts with a file of students for whom the Exiting Student Follow-Up Record must be reported. This file will also indicate the category/categories the student falls in and which the districts are responsible for updating and reporting information. This follow-up information of what graduates and non-graduates do after high school will be published to the Ohio School Report Card in the fall of 2023.

EMIS CrossCheck is not only for EMIS Coordinators!

EMIS CrossCheck has just released the ability for districts to add users to various areas of EMIS CrossCheck. This ability will allow Special Education Directors and Secretaries, Gifted Staff, Counselors, Payroll Staff, and others the ability to login to EMIS CrossCheck and verify EMIS data for their area, process reports, etc. Adding security to EMIS CrossCheck training will be scheduled in the near future! ODE EMIS Focused Training - For ALL District Staff

Enhancements to the INFOhio Website

Don't miss the enhancements to the INFOhio website! The INFOhio website has been updated to make it easier for students, educators, and parents to find educationally appropriate tools and resources to meet learning needs.

Here are just a few of the updates made to the INFOhio website:

- Grade-level buttons have been made larger on the homepage to draw students' attention to recommended resources.
- Fetch and ISearch floating buttons are available on most INFOhio web pages. Clicking a floating button opens a search widget, which allows students and educators to search Fetch or ISearch.
- The buttons directing educators to additional information and training materials are now more prominent. Clicking the i button or More Info button will take users to the resource information page.
- Resources are now organized alphabetically in horizontal rows rather than in vertical columns. This reduces the amount of scrolling to find a specific resource.
- The All Resources button has been moved to the Educator Resources and Tools page so that educators have easy access to all INFOhio digital resource collections.

INFOhio Added New Instructional Materials to Open Space

Explore the new instructional materials added to Open Space! Open Space, a curriculum creation and collaboration tool powered by INFOhio, empowers educators to create and share resources that promote innovative and collaborative learning. Instructional materials added to Open Space go through an evaluation process using a quality rubric. In addition to finding quality instructional materials, Open Space users can view and rate resources and also share content to Google Classroom.

Explore the latest resources added to Open Space:

- Career-focused lessons and activities from the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) Office of Graduate Success: The learning materials include 39 activities created by the team at ODE and emphasize Career Connections across academic content areas, where students in grades K-12 can explore careers and pathways to get there. Check out the Career Exploration Resources collection on Open Space to see the new Career Connections materials.
- Computer Science Fundamentals Curriculum from Code.org: Each of the <u>97 lesson plans for grades K-5</u> feature interactive activities and videos for students that use easy-to-understand language and fun, familiar characters. For teachers and parents, the lesson plans include slide decks (via Google Docs), teaching guides with discussion questions, and alignment to national CSTA K-12 Computer Science Standards.
- GenYES curriculum: GenYES Ohio is a program that prepares Ohio students to become student technology leaders through a rigorous, technology-infused leadership curriculum. The GenYES Ohio program can introduce students to computer science, coding, and STEM careers, as well as careers in teaching and education. The program is flexible and designed to support school technology integration goals while building the next generation of technology leaders.
- · iCivics Social Studies collection from iCivics.org: More than 250 new social studies lesson plans, interactive games, and learning modules from iCivics.org, a non-profit organization dedicated to providing quality educational materials for social studies and civic education, have been added to Open Space. The instructional materials in Open Space can help middle school and high school educators find supplemental materials and lessons to use with their students.
- Lesson plans from Ohio History Connection: These <u>28 lesson plans for grades 6-12</u> are aligned with Ohio's Learning Standards for Social Studies and English Language Arts. The plans feature activities using primary source documents available through the Ohio Memory Collection, a collaborative project between Ohio History Connection and the State Library of Ohio. Students will explore the topics of World War I, Immigration, World's Fair, and the Atomic Age.
